TP: Lastly, how do you see yourself communicating with the student population this year, given that no meeting minutes were written or posted last year?




Scarcity of Green Backpacks For Sale Attributed to BHScs

Big Boba's Dirty Secret: Analyzing the Psychoactive Agents in Bubble Tea

ABSTRACT: Bubble tea beverages from vendors (n = 5) within a 5 km radius of McMaster University were tested for psychoactive agents. The results indicate that the drinks contained traces of 'substance X'- a compound that has been known to be used in mind-control experiments.

Discussion: Bubble tea is a popular beverage among Health Sciences students for its accessibility and taste, with some students self-diagnosing themselves with a "bubble tea addiction" (BTA). 
Sinners

After thorough consideration, McMaster University has decided to open its worldrenowned Bachelor of Health Sciences (Honours) program to students online.
